Fifth Sunday of Easter

From the Pastor's Desk

Jesus' command is to love one another, as he has loved us (*John 13:34b*). In the musical *Oliver*, a song asks, "Where is love?" We might rephrase that to "What is love?" In the context of today's Gospel, John's account of the Last Supper, love is living as Jesus lived by giving oneself totally. Jesus washed feet, entered into his passion, and gave himself to God and us totally by dying on the cross. Love entails sacrifice, giving self totally to another.

Anyone who has loved another person deeply knows this kind of love: spouses willing to put a career on hold so that the other can follow a dream; parents sitting up all night with a sick child to bring comfort and relief; children changing their way of living to be with a parent in need. What would you add to this list? Sacrificial love tells people we are Jesus' disciples.

Sacrificial love also ushers in the new heaven and new earth, our reading from Revelation announces. We will know that God dwells among us and frees us from the effects of pain and suffering, mourning and death, when we can find love in their midst and respond to evil with love. On September 11, 2014, Pope Francis said we must be a church that teaches mercy by facing hatred with love, violence with forgiveness, and weapons with prayer. That's how we give birth to a new earth and live, "Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done."

God of love, you gave yourself to us by taking on our human flesh and limitations, excepting sin. Help us to follow Jesus' command to give ourselves totally to you by the ways we love sacrificially.

CATHOLIC HOME MISSIONS APPEAL THIS WEEKEND

Many dioceses right here in the United States do not have enough priests and trained lay ministers to serve their parishes. These dioceses are known as **home missions**. The Catholic Home Missions Appeal supports these dioceses by funding essential ministries, including seminary education and lay ministry training. **Please be generous in this appeal and share your resources to strengthen the Church at home.**



FEAST OF ST. GEORGE – APRIL 23RD The most famous of the **Fourteen Holy Helpers** and principal patron of England. He was a native of Cappadocia in Asia Minor and descended from a noble family. After his father's death he went with his mother to Palestine and entered the Roman Army in which he attained the highest rank. During the persecutions under Diocletian he was discovered to be a Christian, and despite threats and torture he refused to abandon his religion. **He was beheaded on April 23, 303.** He is invoked in spiritual troubles, and in doubts against faith. He is called upon by farmers to **protect their cattle**. He is the **patron of soldiers** and is generally represented as a knight in armor, a slain dragon at his feet.

Operating Budget for September 1, 2015 - August 31, 2016

Not included in this Operating Budget are the Special Collections on behalf of the Diocese and our Haiti Mission, St. Vincent de Paul, Bread of Life Outreach, etc. **These funds are designated in their entirety for the specified beneficiary group or mission**, and may not be used for operating the Parish. These special collections typically amount to \$30,000-35,000 annually, thanks to your generous hearts!

Diocesan Assessments are mandated and, while they are not a true operating expense, they must be budgeted for. The Diocesan Educational Assessment for 2015-16 is \$20,198.00, but we have budgeted for \$10,100.00 (50%), based on what we have historically been able to pay. *If* Offerings for the month allow, we pay the full monthly assessment installment of \$1,683.17; otherwise, we pay one-half of the installment.
