# Second Sunday of Lent

Forty days and forty nights; this Biblical timeframe recurs when an important time of growth or conversion is being referenced. The early story of Noah, the one just man on earth at the time, tells us that the flood was brought on by rains lasting forty days and forty nights. Jesus, early in his public life, goes into the desert for forty days and forty nights to pray and fast. The Hebrew people, after God has miraculously freed them from the slavery of Egypt, doubt God's presence and end up wandering in the desert for an extraordinary forty years in order to purify the people.

Our modern observance of Lent is built on this timeframe of forty days. These days are for the preparation of our hearts, minds and lives so that when our holiest days of the year commence, we can enter as fully as possible into the mysteries of the Triduum (the three days). Following the Jewish mindset that one day ends and the next day begins at sunset, we measure these holiest days from sunset on Holy Thursday. The events of the Last Supper, the arrest of Jesus, His condemnation, death and burial all are remembered on this first of the three days, ending with Jesus being laid in the tomb. By sunset on Good Friday, the beginning of the second day, the Jewish people have begun their observance of Sabbath. Christian writers have often called Holy Saturday, this second day of the Triduum, the day when the Great King sleeps! Finally, as sunset descends upon on Holy Saturday, our anticipation of Christ's Resurrection is peaking. The Church celebrates this great longing for the rising of Jesus with the Easter Vigil, a liturgy that recounts all of Salvation History with great praise and thanks!
