## Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### *From the Pastor's Desk*

The second reading and the Gospel make an interesting pair. In the Gospel Jesus says to James and John, “The cup that I drink, you will drink,” telling them that they will share in his suffering (which must have been a little disappointing, since they had asked about sharing in his glory). This is a constant theme in Mark’s Gospel: the true disciple must choose to share in the sufferings of the Master. In the Letter to the Hebrews, we see this reversed. Jesus is the high priest who chooses to share *our* sufferings: “one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin.”

As followers of Jesus, we are called to humble and not to exalt ourselves. St. Augustine never tired of saying, “There is something in humility to exalt the mind, and something in exaltation to abase it” (*City of God*, book 14, chapter 13). Similarly, St. Benedict speaks in his Rule of the “ladder of humility” that we “descend by exaltation and ascend by humility” (chapter 7). In doing this we imitate Jesus, who “did not come to be served but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many.”

Of course, humbling oneself can seem like grim business, as if one had to seek out every opportunity to be as miserable as possible. But this is not what Jesus or Augustine or Benedict meant at all. Our humility allows us, as the Letter to the Hebrews says, “to confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy.” Our humility should make us joyful, because it makes us companions of Jesus, our great high priest.

Jesus, you are the high priest who knows our needs and presents them before God the Father. Help us to open our heart to you, who desire deeply to share in our joys and sorrows. Amen.

- What does humility mean concretely in my life? What specific things can I do to share in the humility of Jesus?
- Does knowing that Jesus shared in our human suffering help me answer the call to share in his suffering?
