## Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

### *From the Pastor's Desk*

One time, while shopping for wine, I was struck by the sheer numbers and varieties: red, white, Californian, Argentinian, merlot, chardonnay, and even alcohol free. Not all are of the same quality, but all are wine. The first sign Jesus performs in John's Gospel is changing water into wine. Hesitant at first, he not only performs the sign, he also creates the best wine of the wedding feast. Thus, Jesus begins to fulfill the promises we hear from the prophet Isaiah.

Have you thought of yourself as a fine wine? By water and the Holy Spirit we are members of the church. We have different gifts but the same Spirit. We are one in Christ but have diverse gifts. Blessed Louis Brisson, OSFS, founder of the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales, calls this unidiversity. All gifts, great or small, are needed in the Church. They complement one another, like the parts of a body. They are signs that God cares for each of us and for our world. Having drunk of the same Spirit, we become good wine for a thirsty world. It seems the Corinthians thought some were better than others. Not so, says St. Paul. Whether we are a vintage sparkling wine or a newly-pressed varietal, God rejoices in each of us when we live the life of the Spirit given to us. Take time. Drink in the wine of God's Spirit given to you. Let Christ continue to ferment you so your unidiverse gift becomes a fine wine that benefits any and all. Offer yourself during Ordinary Time as an extraordinarily fine wine that gives glory to God.

Good and gracious God, you delight in us. Help us use the gifts you have given us to help our sisters and brothers drink in your love and offer you glory and praise.

**YEAR OF MERCY:** Focus on **The Corporal Works of Mercy**



How might we **Feed the Hungry** and **Give Drink to the Thirsty**? Feeding the hungry seems fairly straightforward. We can help the hungry in simple ways: by making **donations to the local food bank** (*think Bread of Life Outreach*) or, if we have the time, by **helping at a local soup kitchen** for the homeless. We can also take the time to educate ourselves about the problem of hunger in the world, and we can **use our voices and our votes** to petition and pressure our politicians to make the fight against world hunger a higher priority for our

government.

Giving drink to the thirsty can also be accomplished through our role as voters: for example, by **supporting clean water policies** to ensure that there will be clean water for future generations to drink. Meanwhile, right in our own homes we can make our contributions to the effort to preserve clean, fresh water: for example, by using environmentally friendly laundry detergents or by **trying to be moderate in the amount of water we use**.
