Week of May 6, 2018

Sixth Sunday of Easter

We are in the midst of the great and holy Season of Easter in our Church tradition. This Season lasts for fifty days; it is a symbolic number made of seven weeks of seven days plus one! ($7 \times 7 + 1 = 50$) The final day of the Easter Season is the Feast of Pentecost, the fiftieth day! Our Gospel accounts begin in earnest now to focus our attention on the coming of the Holy Spirit. This Gift, given so that we will not be *left as orphans* as Jesus returns to the Father, comforts, sustains and emboldens believers.

Pentecost, itself, is not a Season in the Church. In fact, the next day on the Church calendar, we return to Ordinary Time. Pentecost is the culmination of the Easter event: Jesus, the Christ of God, broke death through his resurrection and has filled us with his Spirit! We have concepts from scripture which we can use to assess how well we have received and embraced the Spirit in our lives. St. Paul, in 1st Corinthians and in Galatians, names gifts of the Spirit and articulates fruits (or evidences) of the Spirit's presence.

The traditional *gifts of the Holy Spirit* are: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. As we listen to the Spirit's effect on the earliest Christians, we can quickly see how blessed they were with these gifts. They witnessed with courage and clarity about Jesus as Lord and Savior of the world.

The *fruits of the Holy Spirit* are ways in which we can discern the Spirit's presence in our lives and in those around us. These fruits (or evidences) of the Spirit are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. When our hearts and actions are filled with these realities, we can know that God's Spirit is dwelling within us. During these final weeks of the Easter Season may we focus our attention on the coming of the Holy Spirit and pray for the Spirit's blessings upon our world.



Frank's Fast and Furious



Frank missed the Turkey Trot (it would have been his 9th one in a row) but he is not going to miss JP's Run the Burg!

Frank Strnad, an active runner, father and husband went to the hospital on November 28, 2017 for what was believed to be a stiff neck. In 5 short hours his world changed dramatically as he lost movement from the elbows down and was taken in for emergency surgery. The doctors found an infection in his spine and after two surgeries, and some tough months of therapy, Frank is home with his family walking, gaining strength and continuing therapy learning to use his arms again.

He would like to thank everyone for the continued support and prayers and would love to have you "walk" the Burg for Autism along side him. Walking 3.1 miles will certainly be a testament to the power of prayer and his road to recovery. This is a cause he has supported for many years and although he is unable, at this time, to run he is alive and walking and will continue to work towards healing.
